

## Singapore Environmental Achievement Awards 2026 Celebrates Diverse Approaches to Sustainability

**SINGAPORE, 26th August 2026** — As sustainability is increasingly embedded into core business operations, moving beyond isolated initiatives or corporate obligations, diverse approaches are arising. This key trend was highlighted by the **Singapore Environmental Achievement Awards (SEAA) 2026**, which celebrates organisations across sectors for their contributions to environmental stewardship.

Organised by **Singapore Environment Council (SEC)**, SEAA 2026 brings together organisations at various stages of their sustainability journeys. This year’s submissions demonstrate that there is no one-size-fits-all approach. Instead, companies are addressing the environmental challenges most relevant to their operations, leveraging their capabilities, resources, and influence to drive meaningful change.
