

## **Singapore Environment Council Announces Winners of Interschool Recycling Contest**

- Forty-five schools raced to recycle the most PET bottles
- Winner gets to visit Coca-Cola's plant in Kuala Lumpur and go on an eco-trip to Pulau Ketam

**Singapore, 28 February 2020:** Singapore Environment Council (SEC) announced today that **Zhenghua Secondary School** has emerged as the overall victor of the interschool bottle recycling competition **One Less Plastic – PET Bottle Collection Contest** with **67 kg** of PET bottles collected.

In total, **45** schools took part in the contest organised by SEC in partnership with Sembcorp Industries (Sembcorp) and sponsored by **Coca-Cola**. Ms Sharon Tan, Director, Public Affairs, Communications and Sustainability at Coca-Cola Singapore and Malaysia presented the top prize to the student representatives of Zhenghua Secondary School. The 3D2N trip to Malaysia is sponsored by **Coca-Cola**.

On the trip, the students will get to visit Coca-Cola's bottling plant in Kuala Lumpur, as well as get the opportunity to explore Pulau Ketam, a small island near Port Klang that is vulnerable to marine debris. Since 2015, Coca-Cola has worked with the Malaysian Nature Society to improve waste management at Pulau Ketam, including implementing composting and recycling programmes, and conducting environmental education programmes.

"The students have done an excellent job in recycling PET bottles. After SEC's One Less Plastic campaign, we hope they will continue with good recycling habits and pass on the message to encourage friends and family members to recycle PET bottles the right way as all it takes is three simple steps, 'Rinse, Dry and Recycle'. The students' recycling efforts have contributed towards waste reduction, conservation of natural resources, and reduction of greenhouse gas emissions," said Ms Tay Sok Leng, Head Business Strategy & Development, SEC.

Ms Sharon Tan, Director, Public Affairs, Communications and Sustainability at Coca-Cola Singapore and Malaysia, concurred. "We believe that every package should have more than one life, including PET bottles which are fully recyclable and have value beyond its initial use. This is why we are heartened to see such great participation from the schools and we would like to thank every school who joined the competition. The One Less Plastic Campaign has been a great way to raise awareness about the importance of recycling and the value of PET plastic among the young. We look forward to continue working with the Singapore Environment Council to drive environmental awareness and to spread the message of Recycling Right."



Mr. Neo Hong Keat, Senior Vice President (Waste Management), Sembcorp, said, "Single-use plastics such as PET bottles are a concern due to the high consumption and the damages they can cause to the environment. There are also recycling challenges when PET bottles are contaminated. We are therefore very proud to support this inter-school competition which collected over 600kg worth of clean bottles that are fit for recycling. It goes to show that when like-minded organisations work together, we can help create a more sustainable future."

As part of the **One Less Plastic – PET Bottle Collection Contest**, participating schools were provided with a 660L recycling bin for the collection of used PET bottles from November 2019 to February 2020. During the three-month competition, Sembcorp's 'ezi' recycling app facilitated the convenient collection of bottles from the participating schools. Overall, the project amassed more than 600 kg of recyclable PET bottles. The overall scores were assessed by SEC based on each school's total weight of PET bottles collected in relation to the school's population comprising of students, educators, and non-teaching staff alike.

To make the contest more challenging and to inculcate the concept of recycling right, a **10% penalty** was deducted from the score of a given collection if **food or liquid waste** and/or **non-PET bottle materials** were found in the bin.

The One Less Plastic – PET Bottle Collection Contest is the second part of a two-part outreach campaign, One Less Plastic Campaign, launched in 2019. The campaign aims to foster a recycling culture amongst the students of Singapore and get them to take ownership of decisive action against environmental damage. The first component, Recycling Bin Design Contest, held last year, saw 20 schools submit many unique and creative takes on the humble design of the blue recycling bin.
