



Young Changemakers Champion Sustainability at the School Green Awards 2025 **Organised by Singapore Environment Council, supported by Keppel**

Singapore, 17 November 2025 - The next generation of environmental stewards took centre stage today at the **24th School Green Awards (SGA) 2025 Presentation Award Ceremony**, held at *HomeTeamNS @ Khatib*. The event, organised by the Singapore Environment Council (SEC) and supported by Keppel Ltd (Keppel), through its philanthropic arm, Keppel Care Foundation, celebrated schools across Singapore that have demonstrated excellence in environmental education, innovation, and sustainable practices.

Graced by **Acting Minister for Culture, Community and Youth, Senior Minister of State for Education. Mr David Neo**, this year's ceremony recognised the creativity and commitment of students and educators who have integrated sustainability into their school culture and community outreach.

Empowering Change Across Schools and Communities

This year's School Green Awards saw over **300 schools** participating across preschools, primary, secondary, international and special education institutions. Collectively, these schools reached almost **1.1 million individuals** through their projects and community initiatives — ranging from biodiversity-friendly gardens and water conservation drives to food waste reduction and creative upcycling activities.

Nurturing a Generation of Green Leaders

The Outstanding Environmental Achievement Award, the highest accolade of each category of educational institutions, honours school that exemplify leadership in environmental advocacy and sustainable living. This year's awardees are:

- **Preschool category:** *MOE Kindergarten @ Jurong West* – for integrating nature-based learning with play to nurture curiosity and environmental empathy among children.
- **Primary School category:** *Yew Tee Primary School* – recognised for its “Eco-Habits for Life” initiative, which engaged students and parents in long-term recycling and resource conservation projects.
- **Secondary School category:** *Yuying Secondary School* – commended for its “Green Up Our Space” programme, which transformed school spaces into biodiversity-friendly gardens and inspired peer-led environmental action.
- **Institute of Higher Learning category:** *Nanyang Junior College* – awarded for its student-driven sustainability campaigns and collaborative research projects that connect science learning with community impact.



- **Special Needs School category:** APSN Chaoyang School – honoured for empowering students with special needs through creative recycling workshops and community partnerships that foster inclusivity and awareness.

Inspiring a Culture of Sustainability

The School Green Awards (SGA), first launched in 2000, has become one of Singapore's most established environmental education programmes.

Ms Isabella Loh, Chairman of the Singapore Environment Council, said:
